THOUGHTS ALONG THE WAY...

Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." – Matthew 22:37-40

Eleven and two-thirds years. Let's call it 12. I have served as your pastor for the better part of a dozen years now but my time with you is almost done and there are some things I want you to know before I go.

First and foremost, I want you to know that I have loved being your pastor at the Little Church With a Big Heart. You have consistently made me proud to be part of this community of faith as you have demonstrated your love of Christ in your generosity and your ministries.

I also want you to know that Meri and I have loved you dearly. We have loved you as a community and we have loved you as individuals, and we will continue to love you, each and every one of you, even though we will not be able to be a part of this community and ministry after I retire. Our love, our friendship will endure.

When my class was graduating from seminary, Professor Ted Peters told us that a pastor's job boils down to two things: Proclaim the Gospel and love the People. It sounds easy, but sometimes the Gospel rubs the People the wrong way or pushes their buttons. When that happens, sometimes people respond in ways that make loving them a bit challenging. I want you to know that, on the whole, loving the people at Gloria Dei has been easy, and I think that's largely because, on the whole, you have been receptive to the Gospel. Serving here has been consistently joyful for me, and I love you all the more for that.

If I have had any great disappointment during my time at Gloria Dei, it's that more of you did not participate in our Adult Education classes. Remember that part of the Greatest Commandment is to love God with your mind. Living in faith means that we are called to continue learning better ways to "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with our God." (Micah 6:8) Living in faith means we need to "keep awake" (Mark 13:37) when so many elements in our society would prefer for us to be complacent or asleep to all kinds of violence and injustice, or even nostalgic for a "better time" that never really was.

Having said that, I am deeply grateful for those who did participate regularly in Adult Education as we dove deeply into our scriptures and our history, and as we explored together what it means to be followers of Jesus. The journey we have taken together as we enriched our minds and deepened our understanding has bound us closely heart to heart.

Thoughts Along the Way Continues....

And now, I want to share with you a few thoughts as you prepare to call a new pastor who will lead you into the future that God is preparing for you. I won't have any role or say in your call process, but I do have some advice.

First, remind yourselves as often as necessary that you are NOT hiring someone. You are NOT interviewing job applicants. Being a pastor is not a job, it is a calling. The call process is a process of holy discernment. You will be trying to discern the will of the Holy Spirit, and there is no place for any other agenda. You will be trying to discern who it is that the Holy Spirit is selecting to be your pastor. On the opposite side of that equation, the pastors you will meet will be trying to hear the Spirit, too, to discern if this is the community where God is calling them to serve.

Selecting those who will be on the call committee is also a process of discernment seeking the will and call of the Spirit. Desire to serve on the committee cannot be the only qualification. For what it's worth, I think people who have been faithful and consistent in attending worship and participating in the life and ministries of the congregation are usually more open to the leading of the Spirit. Sometimes people want to serve on the committee because they want to lead the Spirit more than they want to be led by the Spirit. Some may have a particular agenda or a particular profile in mind for their next pastor. But again, the call committee's only purpose is to discern the will of the Holy Spirit and there really should be no other agenda.

In his book Love Wins, Rob Bell retells Jesus' parable of The Two Brothers, aka The Prodigal Son, and in that retelling he points out that these two brothers who grew up in the same household are each telling themselves very different stories about what it means to be a son and about how they relate to their father. Their actions are a result of those stories they're telling themselves, and they both make some serious mistakes because their internal narratives are flawed.

As you move forward in calling a new pastor and into an uncharted future as a beloved community, what stories are you telling yourselves? What story do you tell yourself about church—about what it is and how it works and what it's supposed to do? What stories do you tell yourself about God and about your relationship with God? What stories do you tell yourself about Jesus and how Jesus is involved with your life? What story do you tell yourself about the Holy Spirit and how the Spirit is influencing your life? What stories do you tell yourself about the Gospel, the Good News? How do you understand it? What do you think is most central? Does your story center on Jesus? What does following Jesus look like in your story? What stories do you tell yourself about the world around us and what role does the church play in that world in the stories you tell yourself? Any good psychologist will tell you that our narratives define our actions. So when is the last time you really listened to the stories you're telling yourself?

One last piece of advice for all of you, but especially for the call committee: read the Gospels. I've said this consistently throughout my ministry. Read the Gospels. Read them slowly, carefully and thoughtfully. Then read them again. Then read St. Paul's letters, especially his letters to the Corinthians and Galatians. Then read the Gospels again. Read Love Wins and What is the Bible? by Rob Bell. Read Help, Thanks, Wow by Anne Lamott. And pray. Pray for each other. Pray for your call committee. Pray for your Council and leadership. Pray for the community. Pray for the world. Pray for the light and love of Christ.

Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:6-9)

I will miss you all more than I know how to say. God be with you. With much love, Pastor Steve
