# SPIRITUAL NOTEBOOK

God of love, You are love and to live in love is to live in You. I long to live in that fearless, joyous love. Fill me with Your Spirit, and carry me ever deeper into Your love, until fear dissolves and Your love flows freely through me.

# **GROW A FORGIVING HEART**

# 1. Decide to forgive.

As Fed Luskin, Ph.D., director of the Stanford Forgiveness Projects, says, "Forgiveness changes the present, not the past—It's a choice you make to heal yourself.

# 2. Be patient.

Sometimes a hurt you thought was healed might resurface. If that happens, look at the situation from where you are now. Recognize you have grown.

# 3. Surrender the idea that you are right.

Instead of rehashing an offense, try to be kind, compassionate & understanding.

# 4. Breathe out past hurts.

When you feel stuck in anger, take a deep breath and let yourself relax. As you exhale, say, "I'm ready to move forward. I forgive."

# 5. Write your own apology.

If the person is no longer in your life, you can still have closure by writing down the words you have longed to hear. Consider them a gift to help you forgive.

# 6. Cultivate a forgiveness plant.

Use a plan that you have, or buy a peace lily or purple hyacinth, which traditionally means "I'm sorry'. Every time you water it, picture yourself releasing bitterness or regret and finding peace.

# 7. Walk away the hurt.

Go outside with the intention of working through whatever is weighing on your heart. Sometimes physically moving forward can help you move on emotionally.

### 8. Forgive yourself.

Dwelling on something you wish you hadn't done? Give yourself a hug and say, "I'm ready to let go of this guilt, and begin, anew."

### 9. Look to animals for inspiration.

Often they are harmed by humans, yet they open their hearts again and again to love.

# 10. Turn to Scripture for healing.

If you keep a mental list of who harmed you and how, replace it with Bible verses about forgiveness, such as 1 Corinthians 13:4-5.

### 11. Don't sweat the small stuff.

Did someone cut you off in traffic? Make a snarky comment on social media? Let it go.
