A PRAYER FOR DURABLE JOY

Our hearts ache, but we always have joy. We are poor, but we give spiritual riches to others. We own nothing, and yet we have everything." - 2 Corinthians 6:10

Joy is a radical concept in the Bible. Difficult circumstances accompany many verses about joy. The Bible tells us to rejoice when we suffer (Romans 5:3) And to consider it joy when we face trials (James 1:2). The Bible says to be glad when we are persecuted because we will be rewarded in heaven (Matthew 5:12). And to greatly rejoice when we experience bouts of grief (1 Peter 1:6). This concept confuses most of us because we equate joy with happiness. Happiness is a fleeting emotion completely dependent on our experience or circumstances. For example, I feel happy when it is my birthday, but then I don't feel as happy the next day. Or I feel happy when I win a game, but when another player wins in the next round, my happiness is squelched.

But joy is not a feeling, and it is not fleeting. Joy is not dependent on favorable circumstances. If anything, the Scriptures insinuate the opposite. The more unpleasant our circumstances are, the greater the opportunity to experience joy. Joy, unlike our fleeting feelings, is durable. Joy persists despite hardship. Joy propels us to endure despite extreme difficulties. Joy is never-ending and ever-present. When Jesus endured the heinous suffering of the cross, He was empowered to do so because of joy.

...because of the joy awaiting him, he endured the cross, disregarding its shame. Now he is seated in the place of honor beside God's throne." - Hebrews 12:2

Joy is durable because it is found in the presence of God, not in the absence of struggles.

"You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore." - Psalm 16:11

Today if you're facing unfavorable circumstances, acknowledge and experience the durability of the joy made possible by Christ. I hope you understand that joy is always available in difficulties and despite hardships. Our hearts may ache, but we will always have joy because of our relationship with Christ (2 Corinthians 6:10).

Let's pray:

Dear Lord,

I don't know what my brother or sister in Christ reading this message are experiencing right now, Lord. They may face the deepest heartache or the most ravenous trial or difficulty of their life. Lord, I don't know the details, but you do. You see them struggling. And not only are you carefully watching over them, but you suffered just like them. You were despised. You were mocked. You were rejected. You were hated and spit upon. You were jeered at and insulted. You were beaten and shamed. You were stripped of your dignity. You suffered for our sake. You were wrongly punished for our shortcomings and sin, Lord. You deeply and compassionately understand my friend's suffering. And you endured your suffering by thinking about the joy of being with us in heaven for all eternity, where there would be no more sadness and no more sin. Amen.

WELCOME PASTOR RUTH...

Dear Saints of Gloria Dei,

I am so looking forward to being your Interim Pastor, starting in July. You will be my 11th congregation I have served as an Intentional Interim Pastor, having been specifically trained to serve in this specialized ministry. I learned, as a person with ADHD, I am a much better sprinter than I am a marathoner. In spite of the inherent insecurity of this sprint, I really believe that I can use my best gifts and skills in this capacity. And yes, I have served five congregations as a settled pastor, so interim work is not my only experience.

I was born and raised in the small town of Perrysburg, Ohio (outside of Toledo), the youngest of 6 children. I have one sister, who is the oldest, followed by 4 brothers, and then me. Both of my parents have died, as have my two oldest brothers. (I also have an extended family in Southern California that adopted me when I did my internship in Buena Park, but I will tell you more about them along the way.) I went to college nearby at Bowling Green State University and received my BS in secondary education Speech and Theater. It was while I was in college that I attended the University Lutheran Chapel with friends, and eventually was confirmed as a Lutheran. While I had grown up in the Methodist Church, interest waned in high school.

After College I moved to Berkeley to attend Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary (PLTS) as a special student for a year because I did NOT want to teach High School and didn't know what else to do. I believe that the Holy Spirit had to take me through seminary and the process of becoming a pastor one small step at a time, lest I bolt. I was not affirmed in this process by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod Campus Pastor who confirmed me, but once I got to seminary, I was so regularly affirmed in this call by my classmates and faculty that it took me a long time to trust it. To go from no affirmation to affirmation from so many sources was foreign indeed.

Since I went to seminary just six years after our Church decided to ordain women, it's not been an easy journey. While I was in several relationships with men in the 1980's, none of them were willing to take the step of becoming a pastor's husband. In spite of all of that, I love being a pastor. I fall in love with every congregation I serve, and I am certain that Gloria Dei will not be an exception. I love to preach, preside at worship, and teach. I love to work

with the council and congregation as partners in ministry. It brings me great joy to help a congregation go through the process of moving from your last pastor to calling your next one. Oh, and I love to laugh and have fun!

MID YEAR BUDGET UPDATE

Revenue in 2023 has averaged \$18,188 per month compared to \$16,319 per month in 2022. This is an increase of \$1,869 per month (11%). With expenses in 2023 increasing only \$888 per month we are in a solid financial position as we begin the search for a new pastor.

There may be changes in these figures as we proceed through the call process and funding a new full-time pastor will present challenges. But for the near future our balance sheet reserves are good and the current net income is positive.

Pastor Ruth has received special training to support congregations through the stressful time in calling a new pastor. I'm looking forward for our church family to get to know her and for Pastor Ruth to get to know our wonderful members and friends. She has many talents including singing and quilting plus, she loves to share her love of the Lord! We are so fortunate to welcome Pastor Ruth on July 2nd!

Call Committee - On June 18th the committee met and elected Bob Siemer as the chairperson.

There are pathways for our call process based upon our financial feasibility to pay a pastor the recommended salary as determined by the Synod. One of the requests by Synod is that we have a GROW meeting with the members of our congregation. GROW is an acronym for: Goals and aspirations, Reality (current obstacles or situations), Options (strength and resources), Way forward (accountability and personal actions – what, when, by whom, and the will to do it). As part of our discussion, we gareed that we would have a GROW congregational meeting towards the end of August after Pastor Ruth has had time to assimilate and get to know our church family. More information on this meeting will follow and several announcements will be made as to the date and time to ensure as many of the members can attend this important meeting. Everyone's input at this meeting is very important as we seek to find the best pathway in calling our new pastor.

LSS: The 'Back to School Supply Drive' is on! A flyer with a list of supplies is in this issue and also available in the Fellowship Hall. The supplies are needed by August 24th. As school approaches, children's clothing in good condition is needed. New socks and underwear are always in need. LSS is also in need of gently used men's clothing and shoes in support of their job finders' program. We continue to make nearly weekly deliveries because of the generous givers within our church family and friends.

Fe y Esperanza: Pastor Marta has been in the hospital this month and needs our prayers. She is home now and appreciates our cards and especially our prayers. We will be resuming deliveries typically on Wednesdays. Fe y Esperanza always welcomes grocery bags for their food distribution program.
