BE OF GOOD COURAGE...

On Sunday, May 26, we entered into the "Season after Pentecost." Or as the Roman Catholic Church calls it "Ordinary Time", which I rather like. We started the Church Year with Advent, then Christmas, Season after Epiphany, Lent, and Easter: these are the seasons of Jesus: the anticipation of his coming, birth, life, death, Resurrection and Ascension. On Pentecost, we started the season of the Church. First, the coming of the Holy Spirit that enabled the beginning of the Christian Church. The Day of Pentecost is often called the birthday of the Church. Then we had to affirm the Trinity. Maybe we just had to get some Church Doctrine in there to remind us of the mystery of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit but one God. Now comes the I o n g green season, which lasts about the same time as the seasons of Jesus, about 6 months.

This time of year is about the work of Jesus throughout his ministry, and the beginning of the Church. It is about our work as the Church, living out the Gospel, building up and loving God's people. This is not a season of great festivals, but of the everyday work of being the Church. The green of the season is about new life. Gardens and fields planted to bear food and the beauty of flowers. Of course, in California, one growing season moves into the next growing season, year around. Isn't that one of the reasons we live here? I know it is for me. But only summer brings many of my most loved fruits and vegetables, and especially tomatoes! I can never get enough of fresh tomatoes.

Just as we indicate the change of our seasons of the Church Year with our paraments – the fabric pieces we put on the altar, pulpit, lectern as well as the banners, our worship changes to reflect the ebb and flow of the seasons. It makes sense to make our liturgy simpler in the summer. Summer is a simpler time of the year. A lot of activities take breaks for the summer, like our Sunday Adult class and our Wednesday morning Zoom Book Study. You probably have organizations you belong to that take breaks in the summer. While we are not going to take any breaks from Worshipping in the summer, our liturgy will be simpler. For example, we won't be singing a canticle of praise. I won't be chanting the psalm, but we will read it responsively. (Though I think we will sometimes have the treat of Phil singing the psalm!)

Be of Good Courage

There will even be some time when we will not have the confession in worship! I know that this shocks you all! How can we possibly have worship without confession? If you remember, I have told you that before Martin Luther's new awakening to the Gospel, he was an obsessive confessor. He used to drive the Augustinian Monks to whom he confessed crazy. He would want to confess every day, and often several times in the day. They passed him among the other Monks because he very quickly got tiring to them. Once his confessor said "Martin, all God wants is for you to love him!" Love him? replied Martin. I hate him!" This was because Martin had turned God into the demanding tyrant that his father was. In his new understanding of the Gospel, he knew that 1, we can never confess all of our sins, and 2, God forgives us even when we do not enumerate our sins. Thus, in our liturgy, confession is a "may" rubric. We may or may not have confession or the Thanksgiving for Baptism we have had during the Easter Season. Worship is still fully worship without our corporate confession.

I enjoy the simpler liturgy of this time of the year, as much as I enjoy the fullest liturgy during other seasons of the year. It's nice to have a bit shorter, more casual worship of summer.

So, notice the changes in the rhythm of our worship as it reflects the rhythm of our lectionary (the four readings we read each week). Just come, and worship whenever you are in town. Because we all need to hear the Word and be nourished at the Table of God. We all need to be together, get some hugs, good conversation, a cup of coffee, and some goodies together.

Board of Regents medals awarded for teaching excellence

Fondly known as **Tiana** to our congregation, daughter of **David and Nancy**, we revel in her continued accomplishments as an educator and a role model for students of color. Congratulations...may the world be inspired and filled with God's grace because of your genuine love for learning.

The award was the Board of Regents highest teaching award given in the University of Hawai'i system. My medal was presented by the **President of the UH** system and included a letter of commendation from the governor of Hawai'i. It was an especially poignant award for me, as so much of my pedagogy had been shaped by the great teachers in my life— my mom first and foremost.

Kristiana Kahakauwila is an associate professor of

English in the UH Mānoa College of Arts, Languages & Letters. For Kahakauwila, a teaching philosophy rooted in choice is one rooted in kuleana—in responsibility, privilege and a sense of ownership. Her teaching leans into analysis of how a work is shaped, and from where it takes its inspiration in the context of race, gender, sexuality, ability, indigeneity and other lived experiences. Her students express an experience of being treated not "only as students but as writers and readers. She gives us a chance to grow and progress, first and foremost, as artists." Kahakauwila's innovative pedagogical technique includes asking students to take up the mantle of instructor at least once each term. A former graduate student describes Kahakauwila as a "devoted, kind and brilliant teacher who challenged students in a way that was joyful and meaningful."
