



### Outreach

The bags for this summer's Country Pantry "Kids Packs" program are available in the rear of the church. We have taken on the ambitious challenge in conjunction with the Sesquicentennial Celebration to have 150 bags filled in time for the Block Party on June 8th. Your bags can be delivered to the "Baby Blue Beardsell Pickup" at the foot of William Street during the Block Party. There will also be a Pantry informational table set up at that location. If you are unable to deliver your bags at that time, feel free to bring them to the church. Also, don't be intimidated. This is a summer long program, so bags will be accepted through the middle of August. These go to children in our community who depend on their school lunch program throughout the school year for a healthy meal, but for whom none is available during the summer months.

Speaking of August, plans are in the works to have more of our Haitian Art on hand to sell at the Clinton Arts and Music Festival at the end of August with the proceeds to support the ongoing relief efforts in Haiti.

Last but not least, a number of our members continue to volunteer at Hope House and were honored along with all of the Hope House volunteers at their recognition dinner last week. St. James will again be preparing at least two meals at Hope House this summer; dates to be announced. The duties may be shared with Rite 13.
