The Way I See It

Here's a question for you: "What do you want to receive from this church?" I realize this may sound like a leading question but it isn't. I ask it for no other reason than to invite you to simply try and answer it. And as you ask it of yourself I encourage you to answer it honestly. Do some soul searching. Take advantage of this last little bit of summer before life kicks into high gear again in September and ask yourself "what is it that I am seeking from St. James Church?" There's no right or wrong answer. Each of us will answer differently but I do think the answer may be helpful-not only to you but to this church. The way I see it, if we don't know what we want, we won't ever know if we are receiving it. On the other hand, if we don't know what we want chances are we will never go looking for it.

It seems to me, as the church, we do a pretty good job of asking folks to give but rarely do we ask folks what they want to receive? We make plans and develop programs because we think we know what people want. For example, since we are a church we suppose that people come here because they want to worship. Therefore, based on our Episcopal liturgy we plan weekly services for worship. As a church we also believe people come here to grow spiritually so we offer opportunities for people to explore their spiritual lives. We guess families want religious training for their children when they come to this church so we offer Youth Confirmation, Sunday School, Children's Choir and other activities for them. Some want opportunities for fellowship so we host Coffee Hour and plan potluck suppers. And then there are those who want to live out their baptismal ministry through service to others. So we invite Eucharistic Visitors to take communion to our shut-ins and infirmed, we send out people to El Salvador on medical mission, we ask the laity to serve on our ministry groups and vestry.

From the Appreciative Inquiry responses we recently received we also know there is a strong need from a number of folks that St James simply be here when needed. Folks want to know that when there is a birth, a marriage, a crisis or a death in their family this church will be here. They want St. James to be here for baptisms, a celebration of marriage or a burial service. Spiritual roots to this sacred place run deep for many people and simply knowing that we are here is enough. Other folks simply want to be on our mailing list to receive our newsletter. And there are any number of other things people want from this church.

The way I see it, as the church, we are called to respond to a variety of needs. Granted it is not always easy knowing exactly what people want or need and how to respond but striving to be responsive and inviting is our mission. In my growing up years we went to church because it was the thing to do. There were no other obligations for our family on Sundays other than to go to church. We went to church because it was the culturally acceptable thing to do. We went to a particular church because that's where we belonged. For many today this is not the case. So what is it you want to receive from St. James Church? Once you have the answer, if you are not receiving it, please let me know.

Vestry Corner

The Vestry met on July 11, 2007. Among the many items discussed were the following: With the capital campaign for the replacement of the church roof being so successful and surpassing its goal, the Vestry voted to authorize the signing of the contract for the purchase of the slate for the roof and for the work for \$102,413, contingent on receiving the Landmarks Conservancy grant. The contract will enable us to lock in today's prices. In addition, for the Clinton Arts and Music Festival on August 25, various activities will be held at St. James. Volunteers are needed to help host during that day. A sign-up sheet for different one-hour shifts is available at the back of the church. The Vestry will not be meeting in August.

Colleen Meager of the New York Landmarks Conservancy visited St. James on July 26, taking pictures and asking good questions about the slate roof project. She was enthusiastic about our success in raising funds from the congregation for this job. On another front we have made a down payment to initiate the quarrying of Vermont Slate for the project, and we have also made a deposit for the purchase of copper to be used for flashing at the eaves. Neither the slate nor the decision by the Landmarks Conservancy will come before October.

Meanwhile, in the Lewis House, two contractors (Dwight Dibble and Dave Winkel) have examined it extensively and will be presenting proposals for renovation. An upstairs/downstairs division of apartments seems to be an interesting option.


Roof Repair Capital Campaign

Thoughts from the Pews

"In a certain small town near here, all the people were very proud of their old parish church. They loved its stain glass windows, its carved pews, its fine tower its shiny brass...but there was one part of it which they didn't seem to care about at all and that was the vestry roof." So begins the delightful British children's book "The Church Cat Aboard" written and illustrated by Graham Oakley (1973). Sampson, the church cat, and two mice friends devise a scheme to raise money for the roofing campaign. After much adventure, they make their way back to St John's church where they are welcomed home. Unfortunately, they raised no money and the roof remains in disrepair. Simpson concludes, "it takes more than a leaking roof to dampen feelings of true friendship."

We at St. James are proud of our church and have found friendship and love within its walls (and under its roof). Many of us identified these as core values/attributes of our church in the recent Diocesan Mutual Ministry survey. We are also blessed with a generous and faithful community. Our "repair of the roof" collection board looks nothing like the storybook St. John's. Rather than 19 1/2 pence of the 6000 pound goal, we have made and exceeded our internal goal of \$85K in pledges. (I will discuss why this is important in the next newsletter.) WE ARE TRULY BLESSED! And I'm certain Pansy, the Rector's cat, is happy she didn't have to endure money raising adventures of her own!.

I thank all of you for being people of faith and Mary J. for loaning me "The Church Cat Aboard." It and other Graham Oakley Church mice books are in the mid-York library collection. Perhaps, you would like to "check out" more adventures of Simpson and his mice friend
