

Every 4 years an equal number of United Methodist laity and clergy gather to discern how God is directing the United Methodist Church's mission and ministry in the world. This gathering, called General Conference, is comprised of elected delegates from conferences (regional groups of United Methodist Churches) around the globe. On April 23, 2024, the General Conference gathered in Charlotte, North Carolina to begin its work.

While it is beyond the scope of this article to share with you all there is to know about how the church is organized and connected, I do want to share with you some basic information about the task of General Conference and some of the work that is happening at this gathering.

Because we are a connectional denomination consisting of nearly 39,000 churches worldwide, the General Conference was established to be the top legislative body (akin to Congress) in the United Methodist Church. Their task, every four years, is to create/revise church polity (church law and organizational structure) and to speak on behalf of the denomination regarding the church's position on societal issues. The product of the General Conference's work in these two areas are printed and bound every four years in the United Methodist Book of Discipline (Church Polity) and the United Methodist Book of Resolutions (the church's official stand on issues).

By the time you receive this newsletter, General Conference will be coming to a conclusion. While the majority of the talk in the news about General Conference has focused on separation, disaffiliation, and full inclusion, there was equally important work done at this General Conference. Some of this work included discussion centering around: Regionalization (restructuring the denomination with the goal of allowing the U.S. churches (like Africa and European churches) to adapt and change the UM Book of Discipline as missional needs and differing legal contexts require), A Revised Social Principles (statements that address the church's stand on social issues like abortion, euthanasia, marriage, etc.), Engage in Acts of Repentance (General Conference will acknowledge the injustices it has participated in (whether directly or indirectly) and to seek reconciliation, Changes to Clergy Pension and Benefits Program, and Strengthening the Connectional tie with the Episcopalian Church. While the bulk of activity centers around decision-making, it is very important for you to know that the work of General Conference always flows from worship and prayer gatherings.

It is from this center that delegates are open to hear the voice of God and one another during their time of "holy conferencing".

Sometime in May, after the conclusion of General Conference, I will lead an informational meeting to share with you the decisions of the conference, how these decisions impact our denomination and First United Methodist Church, and provide you with an opportunity to ask questions. Look for an announcement about that meeting in the bulletin soon.

Until then, please continue to pray for the General Conference and for God's continued work through the United Methodist Church.

School questions, money issues, future plans, health problems....even dating / boy concerns (difficult to discuss when polygamy in her society is the norm!!) What an interesting relationship between a 70 year old, middle class homeowner and a 21 year old college student in Africa whose home has dirt floors, and no running water or electricity.

It has been such a wonderful experience (and culture shock!) for all involved. And she is SO grateful for our support...

Ivy is getting ready to enter a new phase of her college education before she enters her Sr. year. It is what we commonly know as internship. This will involve living in Nairobi (a big city is a huge shock and worry for her) this summer.

In August or September, our Outreach team is planning a fundraiser for some of lvy's coming expenses.

In our June newsletter, you will hear from Anita Burns about Ivy's experiences thru her HS years. And then Ivy will tell us about Living Hope HS.

In the July newsletter, I will share my time corresponding with Ivy as she enters her college years and, again, Ivy will share " her side of the story"....being a college student in Africa!

We hope you will take the time to read these articles in the coming newsletters.

This has been an FUMC endeavor since 2017. YOU all have made such a difference in the life of this African girl through your giving. Our hope is that you will get to know and love her as we (Anita and I) do through years of letters and emails. What a wonderful example of our UM global connectionism!
