STEWARDSHIP

This is Tom Donegan writing. You know me. I am not a theologian but here I am writing the cover page of a newsletter for our church. Yes, the subject this month is Stewardship, and yes, I am the church's treasurer, so at least that part makes sense.

Those of you that have known me for a long time may remember my parents, Walt and Jane. Walt was cool, calm and collected. Jane was not. She was, shall we say, blunt. I will show both of those sides by the time I'm done writing this.

First, the blunt. Ever since Stuart retired in June, attendance and giving have dropped considerably, more than a typical summer would experience. We are currently okay financially and can pay all our bills. This is because we have a ridiculously low payroll every two weeks. We are missing a Pastor and some important staffers. If the current situation becomes the normal pattern of things, we have some major changes to make around here. And I for one don't want this to be the normal pattern of things.

We "simply can not do it alone" is a lyric from the musical "Chicago" and it is true. The 75 or so of us that regularly attend service, and are working behind the scenes in leadership roles and committees have to break with political correctness and light some fires under more of our non attending members. We need to ask them to come to church again. We need to ask them to volunteer again. We need to ask them to financially commit again.

It is commonly accepted that the worst thing you can say to someone who hasn't been attending is "where have you been?" So let's not do that. Let's make personal contact and tell them they are missed. If they have had an issue here in the past, perhaps you can help them through it, or refer them to someone else who can.

If I haven't convinced you, I will try to tie this all to theology by stealing from a writer named Jack Wellham. He feels that when Christ came across Simon (who is called Peter) and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea, and said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men.' he was not telling them to lead Christian lives. Being Christian, Wellham writes, is so generic almost anyone can claim to be one. To be a Christ-follower is much different because He may lead us into some very difficult places and circumstances.

I don't think Christ is asking the members of our congregation to leave our jobs or our families. I don't think He requires radical changes of lifestyle. He wants us to get off our duffs. He wants us to keep First Presbyterian Church of Oneida vibrant and alive in this community because our church does Christ-follower things. That should continue. And if it continues because of us, then we are also doing Christ-follower things. Please pray about this when pledging to this church this year.

Youth Ministry Fall News Information for the 2018-19 Church School Year

September 16th was kick off the new "Church School" year!! Instead of the traditional "Sunday School" for all model, the education of our youth will look like this:

<u>6 months of age through and including Kindergarten</u>: There is no class during the 9-10 am hour; however there will be a 15 minute Bible story each week in the Nursery.

<u>Grades 1-5:</u> There is no class during the 9-10 am hour: however, there will be Children's Church, weekly during church service (except for Communion Sundays/ special events). We will be using curriculum from the website <u>sermons4kids.com</u>.

<u>Grades 6-12:</u> There will be Sunday School during the 9-10 am hour before church. There will also be Teen Church, once per month, for students 6-12th grade.


