GETTING TO KNOW OUR CATHOLIC SAINTS: Saint Anthony of Padua (1195-1231) Feast: June 13

St. Anthony, one of the greatest Franciscan saints, was not from Padua in Italy, but from Lisbon in Portugal. Wishing to die evangelizing the Moors in Morocco, he was forced to return humbly on account of illness. The last year of his short life (he died at 36) was spent in a convent that he founded in Padua, and there his relics are to be found. Indeed, the Saint's tongue is the only part of his body that was found incorrupt upon translation of the remains, a testament no doubt to his fantastic preaching ability. No one suspected Anthony's oratorical talent until he was called upon to preach on an occasion when all others were unprepared and unwilling. Once discovered, Anthony began a short but dramatic career of bringing huge throngs to conversion, including many heretics (hence, his title "Hammer of Heretics"). Mainly, the saint sought peace and mercy in a time of tyranny and avarice. He is credited with a vast array of miracles, the most celebrated of which may be his preaching to fish. Anyone wishing to cast doubt on them all must reckon with the fact that some are well

attested, the Pope was moved to canonize him within one year of his death, and he has ever after been besought for help in finding lost objects. His is pictured with the Child Jesus, Who once appeared to him in a vision.
